# THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF THE SABLES-SPANISH RIVER

BY-LAW NO. 32-98

BEING A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE TAX ASSISTANCE TO CERTAIN ELDERLY AND DISABLED RESIDENTS WHO ARE OWNERS OF REAL PROPERTY IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF TOWNSHIP OF SABLES-SPANISH RIVERS

WHEREAS Section 373 of the Municipal Act, Chapter M.45, R.S.O. 1990 as amended by Bill 106 and Bill 149(1997) provides that the Council of a municipality shall, for the purposes of relieving financial hardship, pass a by-law providing for deferrals or cancellations of, or other relief in respect of, all of part of assessment-related tax increases on property in the residential/farm property class for owners who are, or whose spouses are (a) low-income seniors as defined in the by-law; or (b) low-income persons with disabilities as defined in the by-law.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF TOWNSHIP OF SABLES-SPANISH RIVERS ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

# In this by-law:

- a) "Assessment related tax increase" means tax increases beginning in 1998, as defined under Section 373 of the Municipal Act, as amended by provisions of Section 55 of the Fair Municipal Finance Act, 1997 (Bill 106) and Section 43 of the Fair Municipal Finance Act, 1997 (No. 2) (Bill 149); or tax increases beginning in a subsequent year and calculated in a similar fashion as 1998 assessment-related tax increases as described in above;
- b) "Corporation" means the Corporation of the Township of the Sables-Spanish Rivers;
- c) "Eligible amount" means the "assessment-related tax increase" provided that said assessment-related tax increase for any single year exceeds \$500;
- d) "Eligible amount" means the "assessment-related tax increase" provided that said as assessment-related tax increase for any single year exceeds\$500;
- e) "Eligible person" means a low-income person with disabilities or a low-income of the spouse of such eligible person;
- f) "Low-income person with disabilities" means a person who is in receipt of an increment paid under the Ontario Disability Support Program Act, 1997; or in receipt of a disability amount paid under the Family Benefits Act (Ontario).
- g) "Low-income senior" means a person who is 65 years of age or older and in receipt of an increment paid under the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS), as established under Part II of the Old Age Security Act (Canada);
- h) "Owner" means a person assessed as the owner of residential real property, and includes an owner within the meaning of the Condominium Act;
- i) "Treasurer" means the Treasurer of the Corporation;

- 2. TAX relief granted pursuant to this by-law shall be in the form of a deferral of the annual eligible amount, provided that:
  - a) such owner or the spouse of such owner both occupies or occupy the property in respect of which real property taxes are imposed, as his, her or their personal residence;
  - b) such owner or the spouse of such owner or both has or have been assessed as the owner of the residential real property in the Municipality of the Township of the Sables-Spanish Rivers for a period of not less than one year immediately preceding the date of the application for relief.
- 3. TAX relief granted pursuant to this by-law shall attract interest at a rate as may be provided from time to time by by-law passed by Council.
- 4. ANNUAL eligible amounts, plus interest thereon shall be deferred until the property is sold, at which time the total deferred amounts plus accumulated interest thereon becomes a debt payable to the Corporation.
- 5. IF at any time an eligible person for which tax relief has been granted pursuant to this by-law ceases to be an eligible person, all tax relief ceases and all such amounts plus accumulated interest thereon immediately become a debt payable to the Corporation.
- 6. THE amount of tax relief granted pursuant to this by-law shall represent a lien against the respective eligible property and be the subject of a lien registered on title to said property, and that the costs of registering said lien on title are the full responsibility of the owner.
- 7. NO tax relief granted pursuant to this by-law shall be allowed to an owner in respect of one or more residential real property than one (l) single family dwelling unit in any year.
- 8. COMMENCING January 1, 1998, owners who are eligible persons may apply to the Corporation for tax relief with respect to their eligible property, on a form prescribed by the Corporation for this purpose.
- 9. ALL applications for tax relief must be in writing on a form prescribed by the Corporation for this purpose, and must be submitted to the Corporation on or before the last day of June in the year for which the application applies. Applications must include documentation in support thereof to establish that the applicant is an eligible person, and that the property with respect to which the application is made is eligible property.
- 10. THAT this by-law shall come into force on the date of passage.

READ a first and second time this 9th day of September, 1998.

READ a third and final time and passed in open Council this 9th day of September, 1998.

# Township of Sables Spanish Rivers – Report, October 2023

Providing Animal Services and By-Law Enforcement Services continues to be challenging. The fall out from the pandemic, the Opiod crisis, Economic issues including the cost of living crisis and the scarcity of skilled workers, continue to be very real problems that many residents face that continue that compound many residents' ability to bring their properties up to standard. We continue to have success in moving cases forward. Initial inspections have been completed on all matters, with follow up inspections, notices, and orders issued in several matters.

We are disappointed Council has yet to adopt the proposed Property Standards bylaw. This new bylaw will give us tools to deal with Residential Tenancy issues outside the Landlord and Tennant Board and the ability to issue Provincial Offence Notices or Tickets for non compliance issues. Currently we only have access to the Part 3 Information and Summons process which is not always the most expedient way to deal with these matters.

Several Trailer licence applications were filed inspections completed on submitted applications. As these applications are submitted, we will work with property owners to bring non complying properties to the standard. Property owners should be encouraged to submit applications and non compliance issues will be sorted out with the new mechanisms in the bylaw.

We have noted that several problem properties have been put up for sale since the adoption of these regulations. We continue to compile a list of properties that we have encountered that were in violation of the previous regulations and will continue to follow up with these property owners and any other properties we observe over the course of our duties.

Several Noise Bylaw cases are working their way through the courts. 22 new noise complaints were received since our last report. We have submitted a Set Fine applications to Staff and hope that these will be submitted so we can issue tickets in these matters instead of Summonses.

- The committee recommends that the deadline for the Age-Friendly subcommittee be extended to November 17<sup>th</sup> to hopefully receive more applications.

#### H MUNICIPAL EVENTS/INITIATIVES

- Veterans Banner Update- 20 banners and supporting brackets have been installed along
  Highway 17 by Espanola Hydro/Public Works. The remaining 13 banners will be distributed
  around the Township displayed in storefronts and at the Legion in Massey. The Deputy Clerk is
  working with the Legion to arrange an unveiling event to celebrate the project and honour the
  veterans involved. The date is still to be determined but will most likely be the week
  before/leading up to Remembrance Day.
- 2024 Ontario Ice Fishing Challenge- the committee recommends that the municipality
  participate as a community sponsor for a third time and that \$500 be allocated to local prizing
  again in the form of purchasing gift cards from local businesses.

#### I COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Township Talks Information Sessions- an update was given on the status of these sessions. The committee noted the sessions promote transparency with the public regarding Township operations and is a good learning experience for staff.
- After meeting note: attendance of non-staff/presenters Massey-8, Webbwood-15, and Walford-9. Feedback received noted that the sessions were well done, but an evening session would have been appreciated.

#### **Other Business**

#### J BUDGET

- Discussion regarding the 2024 Capital Budget due November 8<sup>th</sup>. The committee discussed various initiatives to include in the budget and 5-year plan. Projects they would like to potentially include are a water or sewage capacity study to support housing initiatives, the restoration of the historical markers, a signage strategy and GIS mapping.
- The Deputy Clerk will work on collecting budgetary pricing to support these projects.

- That the Age Friendly Sub-Committee application deadline be extended to November 17<sup>th</sup>.
- That the municipality be a community sponsor in the 2024 Ontario Ice Fishing Challenge.

#### THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SABLES-SPANISH RIVERS

#### BYLAW NUMBER 2023-40

Being a By-law to amend By-law No. 2003-15

WHEREAS By-law No. 2003-15 regulates the use of land and the use and erection of buildings and structures within the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers deems it advisable to amend By-law No. 2003-15 as hereinafter set forth;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers enacts as follows:

- 1. The area affected by this By-law includes all lands within the boundaries of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers.
- 2. By-law No. 2003-15, as amended, is hereby amended as follows:
  - (a) Section 3.S Definitions is hereby amended by inserting the following: "Short Term Rental Accommodation" Means a building or any part thereof being offered or used as a place of seasonal or temporary accommodation, temporary residence, or occupancy by way of concession permit, lease, license rental agreement or similar arrangement for fewer than twenty-eight (28) consecutive calendar days, throughout all or any part of a calendar year.

Short term rental accommodation uses shall not mean or include a motel, hotel, bed and breakfast establishment, hospital or boarding, lodging or rooming house, as may be defined in the Zoning Bylaw, provided the use complies in all respects with the Zoning Bylaw, but may include other types of vacation homes or living accommodations intended to be used by the travelling public.

- (b) Sections 5.6.1 and 5.18.1 are further amended to include "short term rental accommodations as a permitted use in the list of permitted uses.
- 3. This By-law shall come into full force and effect in accordance with the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990.

#### THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SABLES-SPANISH RIVERS

#### BYLAW NUMBER 2023-39

Being a Bylaw to Provide Tax Relief to Certain Elderly and Disabled Residents who are Owners of Real Property in the Municipality of Sables-Spanish Rivers

WHEREAS Section 319 of the Municipal Act. 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"), requires the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers to pass a By-law for the purpose of relieving financial hardship by providing deferrals or cancellations of property taxes or other relief in respect of, all or part of assessment-related tax increases on property in the residential property class for owners who are, or whose spouses are,

- a. low-income seniors; or
- b. low-income persons with disabilities.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers hereby ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. In this By-Law: "eligible person means:
  - i) a low-income person with disabilities who owns eligible property as defined in this By-Law;
  - ii) a low-income senior who owns eligible property as defined in this By-Law;
  - iii) the spouse of either i) or ii) who owns eligible property as defined in this By-Law;

"eligible property" means residential property within the "residential property class" as defined by the Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990. c. A.31, as amended and the regulations thereto, within the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers including condominiums that is the principal residence of the owner but does not include condominium units forming part of or associated with a tourist commercial establishment;

"low-income person with disabilities" means a person who is in receipt of assistance paid under the Ontario Disability Support Program Act, 1997, as amended;

"low-income seniors" means a person who is at least 65 years of age and who is in receipt of payments under the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS), as established under Part II of the Old Age Security Act (Canada), as amended;

"Municipality" means the Corporation of Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers; "principal residence" is as defined by the Income Tax Act (Canada);

"Treasurer" means the Treasurer of a municipality within which an eligible property is located;

# General Administration

- 2. Applications made under this By-Law shall be made to the Treasurer of the municipality within which the eligible property is located.
- 3. Applications shall include supporting documentation to establish the eligibility of the person seeking the deferral.

4. Applications shall include an authorization signed by the applicant authorizing third parties to release to the Treasurer all information the Treasurer may require to verify the accuracy of the information submitted by the applicant.

# Application for Deferral

- 5. An eligible person may make application to the Treasurer during a taxation year for the deferral of a property tax increase in the taxation year on eligible property.
- 6. An application to determine eligibility for a deferral shall be in a form as set out in Schedule "A" hereto and forming part of this By-Law.

# Evaluation of Application for Deferral

- 7. The Treasurer shall review each application for deferral and determine if the applicant and the property are eligible for a tax increase deferral under this By-Law.
- 8. The Treasurer may, at any time, request the applicant to provide such additional information and documentation as the Treasurer may require in order to evaluate the application.
- 9. An application for tax increase deferral will not be processed if any required information is not provided.
- 10. The determination of the Treasurer as to the eligibility of the applicant and the eligibility of the property shall be final.

# Grant of Tax Deferral

- Where the Treasurer has determined that an applicant and the property meet the requirements of this By-Law then tax relief in the form of a tax increase deferral in respect of the property shall be granted.
- 12. The tax increase amount deferred, together with interest shall be deferred until the eligible property is sold, at which time any deferred amounts together with accumulated interest thereon shall become a debt payable to the Municipality in which the eligible property is located.
- Where an applicant, or the applicant's spouse, each own what would otherwise be eligible properties pursuant to this By-Law, the tax increase deferral granted under this By-Law shall be limited to one of the otherwise eligible properties. The applicant, or the applicant's spouse shall elect which of their otherwise eligible properties shall receive the tax increase deferral and such election shall not be changed without the consent of the Treasurer.
- 14. If, at any time, a person eligible for relief under this By-Law that has been granted a tax increase deferral under this By-Law, ceases to be an eligible person, all tax relief ceases and all deferred tax amounts together with accumulated interest become a debt payable to the Municipality in which the eligible property is located.
- 15. Tax relief granted pursuant to this By-Law for any taxation year shall be limited to one (1) single family dwelling per owner.

#### Interest

Where a deferred amount becomes payable under this By-Law, and the amounts due are not immediately repaid, such outstanding amount shall be

subject to interest and penalties in accordance with the applicable tax collection by-laws of the municipality.

# Lien Upon Lands

The amount of tax relief in the form of tax deferral granted pursuant to this By-17. Law shall be a lien upon the eligible property in accordance with the provisions of s.319(14) and 349 of the Act.

#### **Integrity Provisions**

- 18. Every person who, pursuant to this By-Law:
  - files a fraudulent application; or a)
  - fails to fully disclose their financial circumstances in support of an b) application; or fails to notify the Treasurer of a change in financial circumstances as required herein;

is guilty of an offence and is liable to prosecution and on summary conviction is liable to a fine not exceeding \$5,000.

#### General

- Nothing in this By-Law derogates from any tax deferral or other relief granted 19. under any predecessor to this By-Law, or from any tax lien arising under any predecessor to this By-Law.
- By-law Number 32-98 of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish 20. Rivers is hereby repealed.
- 21. This by-law shall come into force and take effect upon the passing thereof.
